And, whereas, it appears from the body of the order that ~~same~~ was passed on the 14th day of May, A. D. 1921, through error, in the entering and recording same the said date of May 14th elsewhere appears in the order and in the bond form prescribed as May 9th;

D. 1921, and shall become due and payable one thousand (\$1,000.00) Dollars on the 14th day of May of each of the years 1923 to 1948, inclusive; and two thousand (\$2,000.00) Dollars on the 14th day of May, of each of the years 1949 to 1960, inclusive; they shall bear interest at the rate of six (6%) per cent per annum, payable semi-annually, in lawful money of the United States of America on the 1st day of January and the 1st day of July in each year. Principal and interest shall be payable upon presentation and surrender of bonds or proper coupons in lawful money of the United States of America, at the Seaboard National Bank, New York, The said bonds shall be signed by the County Judge, Attested by the County Clerk and the seal of the Commissioners' Court shall be impressed upon each of them. The facsimile signature of the County Judge and County Clerk may be lithographed on the coupons.



ENGINEER'S REPORT OF DRAINAGE DISTRICT NO. 10
TO THE COMMISSIONERS' COURT OF HARRIS COUNTY TEXAS.

Gentlemen:

Having been appointed as Engineer to go upon the land embraced in the proposed Drainage District No. 10, Harris County, Texas, by your Honorable Court, to make a report as required by law and submit same to said Commissioners' Court, I herewith file the following report to-wit:

I have prepared and filed with the County Clerk a map and profiles showing the boundaries of said proposed District, and the location of each ditch, together with all the dimensions and cost of each ditch, and all other data as required by law.

The Field notes and Map herewith filed, show a change of boundaries from the original petition, which I have carefully considered and recommend that they be approved as I deem such a change to be for the best interest of all concerned.

The main outlet of the District in "Little White Oak Bayou". The improvement of same will begin by removing brush and trees one thousand feet south of the T. & B.V. Railroad. The excavation will begin at said Railroad and extend throughout its course to the north west.

The entire District contains 1207, acres. The total length of the ditches to be improved and constructed will be 30.8 miles.






