Since becoming Harris County Judge in 2007, I have come to realize the important role served by the Children's Assessment Center (The CAC). Nationally, one in four girls and one in six boys are at risk of sexual abuse before reaching the age of 18, and over 90% of these victims know and trust their abusers, making it even more difficult to break their silence. Far too many Harris County children face similar crises. Someone needs to be there for these abused children.



Since 2000, The CAC has provided intervention and treatment services to over 30,000 sexually abused children in our community. The mission of The CAC is to provide a professional, compassionate and coordinated approach in the treatment of sexually abused children and their families. The CAC works collectively with its 39 partner agencies to heal victims of child sexual abuse and their families. Together, these partner agencies are committed to providing a seamless collaboration to minimize trauma, break the cycle of abuse, and create a unified effort to empower children, families and community organizations to help children protect themselves. The worth of The CAC's efforts will be measured in vastly improved lives for years to come.

The Children's Assessment Center is a department of Harris County, but the issues involved cannot be addressed by government alone. The collaboration between Harris County Commissioners Court and The CAC Foundation Board of Directors is a strong partnership between the public and private sectors, for the most effective service delivery to children and families.

The CAC is widely recognized as a leader in the advocacy center movement and continues to provide a valuable service to our children as well as serve as a resource for our community.

I am proud of the job done by The CAC. All of us hope that one day we can end this cycle of abuse and all children can grow up free of abuse. In the meantime, we are thankful for The Children's Assessment Center.

CAC PROGRAMS AND SERVICES The CAC programs are designed to provide a seamless collaboration to minimize trauma, break the cycle of abuse and create a unified effort to empower children, families and community organizations serving children, to protect themselves. Ultimately, the goal of The CAC is to promote the complete healing of child victims of sexual abuse and their families by providing them with the necessary resources to effectively handle their trauma and then begin to lead normal and productive lives.

The mission is accomplished through:

- Digitally recorded forensic interviews of children's statements, thereby reducing the need for multiple interviews by various entities involved in a child sexual abuse investigation.
- Sexual assault examinations using digital colposcopy, a non-invasive procedure conducted by trained pediatricians.
- Monthly staffings with the Child Sexual Abuse Review Team (CSART) to review and discuss important cases handled by The CAC. The purpose of team review is to improve the systems that respond to cases of child sexual abuse.
- Therapy, psychological and psychiatric services to help child sexual abuse victims and their families heal.
- Expert testimony in civil and criminal court cases.
- Children's services with events in a child-friendly playroom where children rest and can play while they await services at The CAC.
- Advocacy for children and their families as their cases are processed through the criminal justice system.
- Community outreach and training to heighten awareness and prevention of child sexual abuse.







2008-2009 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Awards and Recognition

The Children's Assessment Center received a Lone Star EMMY Advanced Media Award for the "Preparing Children to Testify in Court" DVD. The DVD was produced with hopes of reducing the anxiety encountered when children testify in court and may also be found beneficial to therapists, social workers, victims' advocates, law enforcement officers and court officials to help prepare any adolescent or teenage child who may have to testify.

The Children's Assessment Center received the LeaderSpring Mentor Award In Recognition of Commitment to Innovation, Excellence and Exchange of Knowledge. The CAC hosted and mentored Vicky Guisada from Child Abuse Listening, Interviewing and Coordination Center in San Leandro, California who visited The CAC the week of April 14, 2008.

Outreach and Education

On October 7th, The Children's Assessment Center launched Hope Shining, a national initiative to increase awareness, prevention and support services for children, families and communities impacted by violence and abuse. The day started at Harris County Commissioners Court where Harris County Judge Ed Emmett presented The CAC with a Resolution recognizing the partnership between The CAC and Safe Horizons, a victim assistance agency that provides support, prevents violence, and promotes justice for victims of crime and abuse. The resolution recognized Hope Shining in Harris County, Texas and urged its citizens to join the Hope Shining movement to help increase awareness and prevention of child abuse.

Multidisciplinary Team

The Children's Assessment Center was able to welcome Communities in Schools as the 37th Partner in March, 2008. Communities In Schools Houston (CIS) is a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization established in 1979 to provide student support services to at-risk youth. With programs in 90 schools in the Houston, Spring Branch, Alief, Aldine and Fort Bend school districts, CIS is able to touch the lives of over 35,000 students and their families annually. CIS is a campus-based, non-profit organization that works with at-risk students in grades pre-K through 12, as well as with their families and communities, to provide opportunity, hope and change.

The Children's Assessment Center also renovated to accommodate the 38th partner agency, Houston Metro Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force, or ICAC. ICAC is managed by the Pasadena Independent School District Police Department and was created to help state and local law enforcement agencies enhance their investigative response to offenders who use the internet, online communication systems, or other computer technology to sexually exploit children. The task force currently consists of six agencies including the Harris County District Attorney's Office, Harris County Constable's Office Precinct 4, Houston Metro, LaPorte Police Department, Tomball Police Department and the Houston Police Department. The goal of ICAC is to prevent future incidences of the victimization of children through early intervention.

Forensic Services

The CAC hosted the National Children's Advocacy Centers Spanish Speaking Forensic Interviewing Training. This training was specifically designed for child interviewers who are proficient in Spanish and conduct some or all of their interviews in Spanish. Bilingual interviewers, law enforcement officers, social workers, and Child Protective Services workers examined current theories and practice related to child forensic interviews, applied lessons from research and practice with English-speaking children to children whose first language was Spanish, explored alternatives for serving Spanish-speaking children and their families and developed and refined interviewing skills during a Child Interview Practicum with Spanish-speaking children. Participants were also able to network, exchange resources, discuss current issues and develop a support system of other Spanish-speaking professionals.

Training

The Children's Assessment Center sponsored a Facilitator's Training for Darkness to Light. Darkness to Light's Stewards of Children is a nationally recognized revolutionary sexual abuse prevention training program that educates adults to prevent, recognize and react responsibly to child sexual abuse. Darkness to Light's staff trains facilitators on a year-long, national basis.
