As Harris County Judge, I express my gratitude to The Children's Assessment Center (The CAC). Nationally, one in four girls and one in six boys are at risk of sexual abuse before reaching the age of 18, and over 90% of these victims know and trust their abusers, making it even more difficult to break their silence. Someone needs to be there for these abused children.

Since 2000, The CAC has provided intervention and treatment services to over 30,000 sexually abused children in our community. The mission of The CAC is to provide a professional, compassionate and coordinated approach in the treatment of sexually abused children and their families. The CAC works collectively with its 37 partner agencies to heal victims of child sexual abuse and their families. Together, these partner agencies are committed to providing a seamless collaboration to minimize trauma, break the cycle of abuse, and create a unified effort to empower children, families and community organizations to help children protect themselves. The worth of The CAC's efforts will be measured in vastly improved lives for years to come.

As a department of Harris County, The Children's Assessment Center understands the role of government and the importance of community engagement. **CAC PROGRAMS AND SERVICES** The CAC programs are designed to provide a seamless collaboration to minimize trauma, break the cycle of abuse and create a unified effort to empower children, families and community organizations serving children, to protect themselves. Ultimately, the goal of The CAC is to promote the complete healing of child victims of sexual abuse and their families by providing them with the necessary resources to effectively handle their trauma and then begin to lead normal and productive lives.

*The mission is accomplished through:*

- Digitally recorded forensic interviews of children's statements, thereby reducing the need for multiple interviews by various entities involved in a child sexual abuse investigation.
- Sexual assault examinations using digital colposcopy, a non-invasive procedure conducted by trained pediatricians.
- Monthly staffings with the Child Sexual Abuse Review Team (CSART) to review and discuss important cases handled by The CAC. The purpose of team review is to improve the systems that respond to cases of child sexual abuse. Team review often reveals additional information affecting agency decisions.
- Therapy, psychological and psychiatric services to help child sexual abuse victims and their families heal.
- Expert testimony in civil and criminal court cases.
- Children's services with events in a child-friendly playroom where children rest and can play while they await services at The CAC.
- Advocacy for children and their families as their cases are processed through the criminal justice system.
- Community outreach and training to heighten awareness and prevention of child sexual abuse.







## **2007-2008 ACCOMPLISHMENTS**

### **Financial**

The Children's Assessment Center Foundation receives Certificate of Recognition from The Better Business Bureau verifying that it meets The Better Business Bureau Standards for Charity Accountability- February 2008 – 2009

### **Awards and Recognition**

The Children's Assessment Center Foundation was rated "Best Charity of 2007" by Charity Navigator. The Best of 2007 winners was published in the September edition of the Houston Press. This high honor was recognized by Judge Ed Emmett in Commissioners Court on October 23, 2007 with this date designated as The Children's Assessment Center Day.

### **Forensic Services**

The CAC joins with Spanish-Speaking Forensic Interviewers from children's advocacy centers across the country through the National Children's Alliance's, NCA n.e.t, to form the first Spanish-Speaking Forensic Interviewers Peer Review through a video conferencing network that allows every connected CAC to see and hear any other CAC live, and in real time. It's very much like being in the same room, but no one has to travel. The Spanish-Speaking Forensic Interviewers Peer Review allows interviewers the opportunity to discuss and compare notes on the unique challenges involved in completing a culturally sensitive, forensically sound, professional interview.

### **Therapy and Psychological Services**

The Children's Assessment Center is a recipient of Johnson & Johnson/Society for the Arts in Healthcare annual grant program. Each year, Johnson and Johnson and Society for the Arts in Healthcare awards funding to healthcare organizations and/or arts agencies working in partnership to produce innovative projects serving patients, their families, and caregivers in healthcare settings and promoting healing and preventative health. This J&J/SAH grant will help support the Safe Boundaries Program for sexually

abused children and their siblings at The CAC. The Safe Boundaries Program is critical for the future safety of sexually abused children and will help prevent future abuse by teaching the necessary assertiveness skills for surviving potentially dangerous situations.

### **CAC Medical Clinic**

Spindletop Charities, Inc. donates \$150,000 to fund the Medical Clinic Digital Conversion in support of the “Serving Children with Enhanced Technology Project.” In the first quarter of 2008, The CAC’s current programmatic digital needs will be implemented in the Medical Clinic, thereby completing The CAC’s Spindletop Circle of Care in digital conversion.

### **Outreach and Education**

Funding for the DVD, *Preparing Children to Testify in Court* was secured through the Children’s Advocacy Centers of Texas Swalm Grant (\$10K), Children’s Advocacy Centers of Texas (\$5K) and matched by The Children’s Assessment Center Foundation. The balance of \$30,000 was donated by VT2 Media in the form of an in-kind donation. The DVD will be used with youth and teenagers allowing them to see (meet) the people and officials involved in the case prior to testifying and giving them a virtual tour of an actual courthouse in order to reduce anxiety about testifying in court.

### **Training**

The CAC partners with the U.S. Attorney’s Office, Southern District of Texas and conducts two days of training for First Responders in Internet Child Sexual Exploitation. Dr. Lawrence Thompson, Director of CAC Therapy and Psychological Services and Dr. Michelle Lyn, M.D., F.A.A.P., Medical Director, The CAC Medical Clinic both presented.
