Precinct2gether Expands Social Services Program

Harris County Precinct Two and Precinct2gether provides numerous opportunities for seniors to not only socialize, participate in classes and go on trips but also helps seniors in need through programs such as Transportation Vouchers, Congregate Meals and Veterans Services.

“Within Precinct2gether, we are continually looking at the programs and services we offer and determining how we can better meet the needs of our seniors,” explained Chara Bowie, LPC-S, superintendent of senior programs for Harris County Precinct Two. “In speaking with our center directors and staff who work daily with our seniors, we realized there is a need for more social services within our department. This past spring, we created the position of program social worker to provide critical information and resources to our seniors.”

Sharon Carter, LMSW, joined Precinct2gether this past summer as program social worker. With the help of two interns, Monica Webb who is working on her master’s degree in social work and Lisa Hernandez who is studying for her bachelor’s degree in social work, Carter is developing the social services area in order to benefit all seniors in Precinct Two.

“I am lucky to work with some of the greatest people I have ever known,” said Carter. “Even though my position is new, we have been providing social services and resources to seniors for many, many years. Through my position, we’re not only consolidating information to make it more readily available to our seniors in need but we’re aiming to broaden our services. For example, a senior may have been a part of our homebound meals program for

years but it’s during a visit to bring the meal where we may find out that there is another problem that we can help with.”

Almost every day, Carter receives numerous phone calls on an amazing array of topics. The variety of calls increased with the

Texas Silver-Haired Legislature: A Voice for Senior Texans

Texas seniors looking out for and advocating for the needs of their fellow seniors is the focus of the Texas Silver-Haired Legislature (TSHL). This hard-working group of 116 seniors became a reality when the 69th Texas Legislature adopted the legislation that authorized the TSHL with the group having its first legislative session in September 1986.

A non-profit organization, the TSHL provides seniors an opportunity to become directly involved with the state’s legislative process. The TSHL’s vision is “that the applied wisdom, energy, and experience of aging will improve the lives of Texans through education, knowledge, and involvement in legislation and governmental affairs.” Members of this group are not lobbyists, pay all their own expenses and work extremely hard for those they represent.

The 12th TSHL legislative session was held this past September giving representatives the time needed to prepare for the 81st Texas Legislature that convenes on Jan. 13, 2009.

destruction caused by Hurricane Ike. “As soon as we were back after Hurricane Ike, it seemed like every phone call we had was different,” explained Carter. “Some seniors were in dire need of assistance while others simply needed reassurance that they were not going through such a hard time alone.”

An important project being tackled by the department’s interns is creating several databases of local social service agencies that can be easily accessed by Precinct2gether. “There are an enormous amount of organizations that can provide assistance in addition to what we have here in Precinct Two so my team is working to develop specific, up-to-date databases that will make it much more efficient for us when we meet with seniors and are looking for the best way to help them,” said Carter.

Many seniors have become aware of Carter’s services simply by calling their local center. Carter also is working to spread the word of her activities by attending group discussions at the various Precinct Two centers. “I emphasize how we can help them and let them know we are available,” said Carter. “I also strongly

encourage them to keep their eyes on their senior neighbors who don’t come to our centers. Some seniors do become isolated over time and aren’t aware of how Precinct2gether can help, so a more active senior is probably the best way to get our message out.”

Carter is working with other local organizations, such as the Area Agency on Aging and the Elderly Service Provider Network, to ensure Precinct2gether stays abreast of what’s going on in the community and what services other groups are offering. “By working together and sharing information, we’re able to direct seniors to the right organizations,” said Carter.

“Getting our seniors the help or resources that will make their lives better always has been at the heart of Precinct2gether,” Carter added. “Through our social services work, we’re doing what we can to make access to these resources just a little easier.”

Event focuses on answering prescription drug plan questions

On Wednesday, Dec. 10, from 9 a.m. – 2 p.m. benefit counselors from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) will be at the Grayson Center's Baldree Building to meet one-on-one with seniors in regards to their current prescription drug plan and possibly finding a new plan for 2009. CMS is a federal government agency that administers Medicare and works with state governments to administer Medicaid.

Seniors may be accompanied by family members for this event. Representatives from the Social Security Administration, Better Business Bureau, Texas Legal Services Center and the Harris County Area Agency on Aging also will be on hand.

Remember: the open enrollment period for Medicare prescription drug plans currently is open and closes on Dec. 31. This is the time when you can make changes to your existing plan or choose a different plan.



Celebrate the Holidays with Precinct2gether



Are You Ready for the Digital TV Conversion?

On Feb. 17, 2009, all U.S. full-power broadcast television stations will stop broadcasting on analog airwaves and begin broadcasting only in digital. This means that if you are watching over-the-air programs on an analog TV, you will need to get a digital-to-analog set-top converter in order for the television to still work after Feb. 17.

Converter boxes will be available from both local and national retailers. These boxes cost between \$40 to \$70 per unit. From now until March 31, 2009, all U.S. households are eligible to request two coupons (valued at \$40 apiece) that can be used to purchase up to two digital-to-analog converter boxes.

To receive a converter coupon, call 888-388-2009 or go online to www.DTV2009.gov. Keep in mind that coupons expire 90 days after they are issued.

Many Precinct2gether seniors enjoy the monthly arts and crafts classes that are offered at the Precinct Two community centers. Classes may meet on a regularly scheduled basis giving seniors the chance to develop their skills in a specific hobby or specialty classes will be offered for the chance to create a one-of-a-kind project.

"One hundred sixty-one resolutions were submitted by members of the Texas Silver-Haired Legislature and we passed 74 of them," explained Steve Coycault, TSHL representative for Harris County Precinct Two. "Currently, we are working to prioritize the top 10 resolutions. Hurricane Ike did slow us down a bit but we will have the resolutions in order before the next legislative session begins."

Deciding the resolutions is only the start of the work of the TSHL members. "We will work diligently and tirelessly to convince the Texas state legislators of the importance of these resolutions to the senior population of this great state," said

Betty Streckfuss, deputy speaker pro tem of the TSHL and the at-large representative from Harris County. "Our resolutions will be published and distributed to the governor and all of the state legislators as well as county judges and commissioners and each of the directors of the Area Agencies on Aging, to name a few."

Before their September session, the five Harris County TSHL representatives met with many senior groups for input. "Since our session, I have been meeting with seniors to discuss our resolutions and the next legislative session," said Streckfuss.

Both Coycault and Streckfuss will be on hand for a meeting with Precinct2gether seniors on Jan. 14, 2009, beginning at 10 a.m. in the Grayson Center's Baldree Building. Seniors are encouraged to attend this forum to learn more about the work of the TSHL as well as provide input on the resolutions.

For those who are interested in seeing the legislative process in action, consider joining other Precinct2gether seniors for the biannual Senior Day event in Austin on Feb. 10. Several Precinct Two buses will be transporting seniors to the Texas Capitol to experience the state legislature while in session and meet elected officials.
